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A New Season

The Bible speaks quite a lot about seasons. In Ecclesiastes 3:1-22, it talks about a time for heal, a time to build up, a time to weep and a time to laugh and even dance! Galatians 6:9 reminds us that we in all circumstances, we should not "grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up."

I looked at 2015 very much as a time to wait upon the Lord with expectancy that He will lead us forward. I thank the Lord that indeed that time of waiting is over as He provides CCCV with a very strong team. 2016 is the beginning of a time to build, to move forward and to reap a harvest bigger than we dare imagine – as we seek the God of harvest.

God has provided properties and land (material blessing) in Nunawading. We can also see that God has brought people into the community, people with different spiritual gifts to build up and strengthen the body of Christ (Ephesians 4). We also give praise and thanks to our God and provider for his faithfulness to our community with the providence of ministers for each language. We welcome again the new team of pastors: Pastor Cyril Chen who joined us last year, Pastor Jonathan Wong who grew up in LifeSpring and Pastor Michael Yu who moved over from Hong Kong with his wife and a little daughter.

This marks the beginning of a new phase of the CCCV Pastoral Team. The CCCV Pastoral Team is appointed by the diaconal board to oversee the spiritual health and direction of the whole church. As a team of four ministers and lay leaders, this team looks into doctrinal and theological matters of the whole church. However the teaching, ministry and care of each congregation remains the responsibilities of the leadership of each respective congregation.

Pastor's Reflection

The past year saw us transition from a one-pastor church to 1.8 as Pastor Cyril Chen joined our church. With Ps Chen helping out, my heavy burden of preaching in Chinese was reduced. While I am still kept very busy with the ministry in LifeSpring with its large variety of needs and demands, I see my workload already being reduced as Ps Jono has enthusiastically taken up much of the responsibility of LifeSpring.

I see that my role and responsibility shifting more to whole church leadership and governance matters. However for the rest of this year, supporting the other pastors would

be the priority. There is much excitement as we think of developing CCCV together as one church community.

Personally, I see this as my greatest challenge – to unite the church, to mobilize everyone to work alongside each other and to glorify God's name as one.

Transitioning into a multi-cultural, multi-lingual church that is truly partnering each other in ministry is CCCV's next huge challenge. My personal hope it that we not only co-exist and live together in peace and harmony, but we will learn to serve together as God's family here in Nunawading. This is not just a pleasing vision, it is a commandment for us (Eph. 4). Our Lord Jesus prayed for us (John 17) that we are to be united not superficially but truly functioning as one in Him.

Serving the Australian Church

Ninety to 95% of my time is focused on CCCV. I am thankful that the church allows me to participate in strategic and important ministries outside of CCCV. Going out of CCCV to serve outside allows me to see what God is doing powerfully in different parts of the world and reminds me that God is indeed almighty and He is doing mighty things everywhere.

The two major appointments I am serving in are most important in the health of the Church. I continue to serve as a director on the boards of the Melbourne School of Theology and the missions organization Pioneers of Australia.

Melbourne School of Theology (MST) is the main inter-denominational evangelical seminary producing both ministers for churches, missionaries as well as scholars. It has the highest number of post-graduate researchers and a respected institute studying Islam and other faiths. Of course MST serves the Chinese community well through its Chinese department.

Pioneers of Australia is one part of an international missions organization with offices including in New Zealand, Singapore, UK, US, Canada, Europe, Africa and Middle East. The main objective of Pioneers is to send teams to unreached people groups with the Gospel to plant churches. We have more than 3,000 workers spread around the world.

The Pioneers board has three main board meetings while the MST board has five. However, each time I come away refreshed and encouraged as I participate in preparing church ministers and missionaries. It is most humbling as well as encouraging to me to serve on these boards. I am also involved in providing care to some missionaries as the Lord leads them to me.

Personal Growth

Towards the end of last year, I was glad that I could have some time off and spend some time on doctoral studies. I thank the leadership of CCCV for allowing me to use my sabbatical leave for my doctoral studies. This is most needed as I have been with CCCV continuously for sixteen (16) years of wonderful ministry amongst people I consider as my family.

For my doctoral studies, I decided on Biola University, which was formerly the Bible Institute of Los Angeles, because of its strong evangelical views and conservative attitude towards God's word. It also has a very mission-minded focus. Biola University founded the Hunan Bible Institute in China in 1909 (see picture). It trained ministers for the Chinese church until the communist confiscated the property in 1952.

The focus of my current studies is on intercultural studies and intercultural leadership in the church. The plan is for my thesis topic to be on CCCV so that it will help us to grow CCCV, as well as benefit other churches working with more than one culture. If everything goes according to plan, I hope to finish the thesis in four years.



I am most excited as the pastoral team lead CCCV into a season of growth and strengthening, focused on the Word of God and the Work that our Lord Jesus left for us. May our Heavenly Father continue to bless and guide us in all that we do!

圣经有许多讲述时节的经文,例如,传道书3:1-22提到医治有时,建造有时; 哭有时,笑有时,甚至跳舞有时。加拉太书6:9提醒我们无论何时,"我们行善,不 可丧志;若不灰心,到了时候就要收成。"

当我回望 2015年,知道是神保守带领中忍耐等候的一年,並相信神会继续带领 我们向前迈进。感谢神,忍耐等候终于过去,因为神亲自为信望爱堂预备了一支强大 的队伍。2016年是建造的开始,是向前迈进的一年,而且收获大大超过我们敢想敢求 -因为我们寻求的是收割的神。

神为我们在 Nunawading 预备了物业和地方,我们亦看到神带领有不同恩赐的 信徒来到教会,一同建立、坚固基督的身体(弗4)。我们感谢赞美神的信实为我们 供应通晓不同语言的牧者。我们十分欢迎我们的新一届的牧者们,他们包括去年加入 我们的陈传道,在英文堂成长的黄传道,以及刚从香港移民来的余传道,他的太太和 女儿。

三位新牧者的上任标志着信望爱堂教牧同工团正迈向新的阶段。信望爱堂执事 会委任教牧同工团专门负责教会的属灵成长和发展方向。教牧同工团是由四位牧者以 及其他平信徒领袖所组成,负责监督全教会的神学和教义的问题。然而,各堂会各自 负责本堂会的教导、牧养和关顾。

牧者的反思

因为陈传道的加入,去年教会由一个牧者变成1.8个牧者。在陈传道的帮助下, 我在中文堂的讲道责任大大减少。牧养英文堂的需要庞大而忙碌,黄传道亦积地承担 了许多英文堂的责任,令我的工作量轻省了许多。 我看到自己的角色和责任慢慢转移到全教会的领导和管理上。然而,我今年的 首要任务是支持及帮助其他三位传道人。将信望爱堂建立为合一的教会,这实在是令 人兴奋。

对于我个人来讲,这是一个很大的挑战-如何使教会合一,如何推动会友一起 配搭事奉,如何一起去荣耀神的名。慢慢过渡成为一个多文化、多语言教会而各自互 相配搭的教会是信望爱堂面对的大挑战。我希望我们在 Nunawading 这个地方不单单 要和睦相处,同时我们亦要学习如何在神的家一齐事奉。这不仅仅是一个美好的愿 景,亦是一个命令(以弗所书4)。正如主耶稣为我们祷告一样(约翰福音17),我 们不是表面合一而是在主里合而为一来发挥功能。

服侍澳洲教会

我百分之九十至九十五的时间都在服侍信望爱堂。我感谢教会允许我参与其他 策划性而且又重要的事工,令我在信望爱堂以外看到神在各地伟大的作为。这提醒了 我神是伟大的,神在世界各处都有祂伟大的工作。

我所兼负的两个职務对于教会能健康地发展都是至关重要的。我会继续担任墨尔本神学院和澳洲宣教基构 Pioneers 的董事职务。

墨尔本神学院(MST)是一间不分宗派的福音性神学院。不但为教会栽培牧 者、宣教士和学者。该学院拥有最多的研究生,而对伊斯兰教以及其他宗的教研究更 是被推崇备至。墨尔本神学院中文部亦为华人教会服务。

澳洲宣教机构 Pioneers 是一所国际宣教组织的一个分支,其他办事处分布于纽 西兰、新加坡、英国、美国、加拿大、欧洲、非洲以及中东国家。这个机构的主要目 标是向福音未曾临到的地方传福音和建立教会。这机构有超过三千名的同工分布于世 界各地。

每年 Pioneers 有三次董事会议,而墨尔本神学院有五次。因为可以有份参与栽 培教会牧者和宣教士,我每次参加会议后都感到被更新、被激励。为这两个机构服务 令我感觉荣幸和受到激励。当神将一些宣教士带到我面前的时候,我亦会参与关顾他 们的事工。

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个人成长

我很开心在去年年底可以申请假期去读博士学位。我感谢信望爱堂让我可以用 我的安息年去读博士学位。因为我服侍信望爱堂已经有十六年之久,视会友如家人一 样,我极需要这样的进修机会。

我选择 Biola 大学去深造博士学位,是因为这所大学的前身是美国罗安琪圣经学院(The Bible Institute of Los Angles)该学院于 1909 年在长沙市繁华地段韭菜园设立 了该校的湖南分院,后正名为湖南圣经学院(见图)。它注重福音,对神的话语有保 守的态度。同时,这所学院又很重视宣教。学院为中国教会栽培了很多传道人,直至 1952 年被中共没收院舍才结束。

我的学习重点是跨文化研究学和教会跨文化的领导工作。我计划博士论文的研 究对象是信望爱堂,以便帮助信望爱堂成长,同时也希望帮助其他类似的教会成长。 若是一切顺利,我会在四年内完成博士论文。

我很兴奋看到信望爱堂在教牧同工的带领下进入一个成长、坚固的时期,专注 神的话语,以及主耶稣给我们的大使命。愿天父上帝继续祝福我们,在一切我们所作 的工上引领我们。

Thank God for leading our family to Melbourne

In the process of coming to Melbourne to serve Chinese Christian Church of Victoria (CCCV), my heart was filled with mixed sentiments. There were moments of saying good-bye to good old friends and moments of thrilling to my new mission in Melbourne.

From Bible seminary to church

Preachings, farewells and family gatherings had pretty much filled up my calendar before I left Hong Kong. Among all, I was particularly thankful that I could preach and visit the

church I served nine years ago. It was then, being a new graduate from Bible college, knowing very little about how to be a minister-in-charge of a church, I was unprepared to serve. However, from the grace of God, the inspirations and encouragements from the brothers and sisters who gave me strength to go through the challenges in joyful spirit.

It is so true, with God's grace to His people, we can all rejoice always (1Th 5:16), in all circumstances, not only in good times, in bad times but times to come.

My personal failure and God's amazing timing

I still remember when I was studying in the United States, I had the privileges to help out some of the students from Mainland China when they were in the States (picking them up from the airport, getting temporary identity cards, opening bank accounts, groceries shopping ... all tangible needs). However, I failed to seize the chances to share with them something beyond - the gospel. After I went back to Hong Kong, I prayed that if God would send me out again to finish the unfinished.

Meanwhile I am not sure if it was related. About ten years ago, I had a dream. The dream was so vivid. In that dream, I was in an airplane, with my wife and a child of ours, around 3 years of age.

Suddenly, there was a man came up to greet me and asked where I was going. I told him I was going to serve a church away from Hong Kong ... before we were able to continue our conversations, the dream was over.

After that, I thought I would leave Hong Kong soon, perhaps went back to the States. Nevertheless, for the past ten years, nothing happened. I still served in Hong Kong comfortably, except, at the same time, I was equipped with personal caring, city evangelism. Time flies. It turned out when I was unprepared, God brought our family to Melbourne.

Looking back, God has His own plan. And Ivy and I are amazed by His amazing timing. For God's ways are higher than my ways, and His thoughts than my thoughts (Isaiah 55:9).

Meeting different brothers and sisters in starting my serving in CCCV

In arriving CCCV, I was able to meet some brothers and sisters here. With God's love through them, Ivy, Breanna and I are able to adapt ourselves much easier then we thought.

Also, by listening and understanding their concerns, I hope, would better prepare me to serve them.

二零一六余超鷹傳道分享

在等候來信望愛堂的服侍過程,百感交集,有不捨時刻,也有在墨爾本服侍並 認識弟兄姊妹之興奮期盼。

從神學院到教會的服侍

我離開香港之前,講道、帶領機構查經組、親友會眾的飯聚和茶聚幾乎填滿我 的日程。在眾多聚會中,我特別感恩,能回到我九年前服侍的教會講道,並順道探望 弟兄姊妹們,更感恩和難得是能夠與他們仍然保持既是牧者也是朋友的情誼。 時光倒流九年前,作為一個剛剛從神學院畢業的傳道,不甚了解如何成為一名署理堂 主任,更不懂如何處理堂務,可說是措手不及。然而因著神的恩典厚愛,我能以喜樂 的心過渡和適應。當中,也看到那裡的一些兄弟姐妹總能以喜樂寬懷之心,永不放棄 的態度,面對堂會各種挑戰,為此自己也深受啟發和鼓舞。

神就是如此真實,憑著祂對祂的兒女的愛,讓大家在任何情況下,無論得時不得時,也可常靠禱告,學習凡事謝恩,以喜樂寬懷之心面對挑戰。

個人的失敗與 神的奇妙安排

我還記得當我在美國讀大學時,我有幸能幫助來自中國內地的學生,主要是往 機場接送他們,帶他們申請暫時身份證,開立銀行賬戶,購物......等,都是一切有形的 需要。可惜,直至他們逐一離去,自己卻沒有抓住機會,與他們分享超越他們的表面 生活需求的東西-寶貴的福音。當自己蒙召或成為傳道時一想到他們,總覺得欠了福 音的債。之後我回到香港,我曽祈禱上帝會再次派我出去接觸海外之華人,特別是服 侍那些離開出生地,或與他們類似背景的人,以完成未完之使命。

與此同時,我不知道這是否是相關。大約十年前,我做了一個夢,夢境生動非 常。在當中,內子和我並我們大約3歲的孩子坐在飛機上。突然,有一個人走過來和 我打招呼,問我要去哪裡,當時我答他說,要離開香港去外邊一所教會服侍.....就要繼 續對談之時,夢即結束。當時我主觀以為我會再去美國,但之後的10年,我仍然留在 香港服侍,而我的生活似乎也穩定安逸,只是在個人關懷上不斷學習,並在一間使命 教會服侍,亦有接觸城市及本土宣教,在不同渠道受裝備。就是,在最沒有準備之 下,神卻一步步地帶領我們一家人來到墨爾本。

而在飛來墨爾本飛機上,幾乎與夢境一樣,我真的與我的內子和我們4歲的女 兒昕樂坐在一起。唯一是,沒有遇到在飛機上與我握手談話的那個人(也許,這是將來 見主面時才能解開的奧秘)。無論如何,我甚為驚訝 神之引導,祂有特定的地點,特 有的時間。我也非常感謝上帝的帶領,因為無論是來澳洲的簽證過程,住屋,家人支 持,在太太工作安排等事上,都感受 神之命定及其完美時機,讓我更深體驗 神的道 路高於我的道路,祂的意念高過我意念(賽五十五9),並各按其時成就美好。

開始信望愛堂之服侍,認識不同的弟兄姊妹

在抵達望愛堂後,我能夠與這裡的同工弟兄姊妹見面。並且神透過他們祝福協 助我們一家人,使我能夠在這裡更快適應。另外,我也有機會聆聽他們、了解他們們 之需要,盼望日後能在主的恩中,一同在信望愛堂服侍以讓更多人得開福音。

Work out the immediate (up to 3 years), intermediate (3-6 years), and long term development strategies of Church property development.

感謝主耶稣的恩典和保守,我們由二0一二年三月二十一日開始,到二0一五 年八月二十八日,已依照聖經信息協會的查經課程安排,完成了第一期查經證書課程, 十多位的學員中共有三位能通過協會的嚴格讀經要求,完成了查考創世記、出埃及記 、馬可福音、羅馬書、詩篇、約翰福音、利未記、路加福音、使徒行傳、加拉太書、 以弗所書、腓立比書等全部十二個書卷,將會在今年的十一月獲協會頒發第一期的查 經證書,以作鼓勵。另外兩位學員因未能完成查考使徒行傳,需要日後補查該書卷才 可獲頒證書。

JaM (Ministry for children aged 3-6)

Years ago, I was drafted at the last minute to serve as a substitute teacher for a children Sunday school because the instructor had an emergency that day. I figured it shouldn't be a big deal to teach to a group of six-, seven-year-olds who were brought up in God's loving Christian families. With teaching materials at hand, all I needed to do was to tell a few bible stories, ask them a few questions and amuse them a little. An hour should be over in no time. Boy, was I mistaken!

Halfway through my first story, a few kids already lost patience and became restless. Two of the boys were especially naughty. Quick wit and sharp-tongued, they lost interest nearly right away and started throwing their toys around and chasing each other. The rest of the kids followed suit and started throwing things. The classroom suddenly turned into an uproarious playground and I had completely lost control of the children. Finally, I gave up and called off the class. Let them play!

Since then, I swore that I would never serve in any ministry involving children again. They are too small, inattentive and frivolous. How could they understand anything about God's truth? I began to see why, over the years, no one was willing to serve in children's ministry. Many people found the task was too difficult and non-rewarding (with the exception of sister Julia, the lone brave soldier who devoted herself whole-heartedly to this ministry). Somehow a few things that ensued began to change my mind.

Not long ago a friend who grew up in poverty told me how she was burdened by her family's financial struggle from a very young age and had always felt bitter and despondent. Fortunately, when she was six years old she had an opportunity to learn about the love and salvation of Jesus Christ. The love of Jesus had changed her and given her hope. She had since become a much happier person for she no longer had to endure all her miseries by herself, but had learned how to trust and walk with Christ. Another friend told me how his little boy, being brought up in Christ, had been jotting down in his diary his prayers for his grandfather since he had learned that the grandfather had cancer. Then there was this most naughty boy in one of my early children Sunday schools, he has now grown up and become a pastor, devoting his life to serve the Lord.

All these attest to me the importance of children Sunday school. I begin to see that despite the children's playfulness and agitation, as long as we can get them into a classroom where God's words are taught, His truth will have an impact on them. At first the words might be in bits and pieces, but they will remain in their minds and eventually sprout in their hearts, turning these once little ones into God loving faithfuls or even church leaders one day.

Then I was given another opportunity to serve young children of age three to six. One day sister Julia came and asked me to substitute for her in the JaM ministry for a month. For years Julia has sacrificed her own worship time and dedicated herself to this ministry, so that she could provide spiritual education to the kids, also allow the parents to attend worship without distraction. Unfortunately sister Julia doesn't get enough help in this important ministry. She is always looking for Sunday school teachers, for most people like me don't want to be bothered with, and when she can't find help, she becomes the sole support for JaM, from gathering the proper teaching materials, preparing for classes, teaching, and taking up all kinds of administration and coordination tasks. She even has to undergo training for this ministry of her own accord. In view of her difficulty I agreed to substitute for her and gave her a break. I also promised to visit JaM first before I took up my teaching role.

It was my first time visiting JaM and I discovered that our church has now so many young kids. They sang hymns and worshipped together, following the guidance of the teachers. Some children were eager participants, clapping and singing while others, shy ones, cried and clung to their parents and had to be consoled by their carers. After the joint worship, the children were divided into different age groups and assigned to different teachers. I was assigned to a group of kids aged between five to six.

After my previous mishap, I earnestly prayed and conscientiously prepared myself beforehand this time. Julia had given me an abundance of creative teaching materials to use in class. They were not difficult to follow. I wrote down the outlines in a piece of paper and tried to memorize them. I also assembled a number of visual aids from the Internet for illustration. To attract the attention and to keep the kids in focus, I brought along my iPad to show them the multi-media contents, and obtained many colourful stickers as rewards for Q & A. Praise the Lord that my effort seemed to work. The children were captivated by the stories and were eager to participate and respond to questions. They were engaging and exhilarated when they got their answers correct. Their simple and childish bliss had in turn brought joy to my heart. I felt so encouraged and satisfied afterwards.

When Julia told me that she would be leaving the children Sunday school ministry, I felt sad but wasn't surprised. It was a near impossible mission due to extreme lack of manpower. She had suffered courageously all by herself over these years, always begging for assistance, which could become a humbling experience even for someone with vision and a strong sense of commitment. It's understandable that she needs a rest.

But then what is to become of JaM? The children need care and spiritual education, the parents need to be able to worship without distraction, and the church needs growth and a devoted congregation. Obviously children Sunday school is a must and cannot be abandoned. I want to raise this issue here and hope more brothers and sisters as well as the parents of the young children see the value and necessity of this ministry and will strive to devote some of their time to serve the Lord and His people. This is a ministry that concerns the future of our children and our church, and it requires all of us to contribute and share the burden. May the work of our Lord prosper through our dedication to Him, Amen.

我對兒童主日學 (簡稱 JaM 或 Jesus and Me) 的感想

多年前的一個主日,兒童主日學的老師突然因事缺席,我被迫要臨時上陣頂 替。本以為只是講講聖經故事,既有材料在手,學生不過是六、七歲的小朋友,他們 的父母都是愛主的,孩子一定不難帶,大概只要哄哄他們,問問他們問題,一句鐘的 差使會很容易打發。

想不到上課後我講故事還未到一半,一些孩子已按捺不住,東張西望,坐立不

安。其中兩位男孩特別頑皮。他們答得快,回嘴多,上課片刻便失去興趣,把玩具你 抛我擲的在課室內互相追逐,其它同學見了也有樣學樣,秩序立時一片混亂。最後我 投降,故事未完便提早下課,讓小孩子玩下去!

自此之後,我立志不再涉足兒童事奉。因小孩子不易教,他們年紀小,又愛玩, 精神不集中,何況真理的事,不知他們能吸收多小。我也開始明白多年來為什麼沒有 很多人願意參與兒童事工,這事工看來不易做,也不值得做。(因長久以來,能定期 參與兒童事工只有 Julia 一人)幸好,一些事情的發生,改變了我的心思。

不久前,一位朋友向我分享, 說小時候家裏很窮,她從小便要分擔父母經濟上的 憂慮,自覺生活很苦和悲哀,幸好在六歲那年,她有機會聽到基督的愛和救贖,心裏 認識了主便變得開朗和學懂交託;另一位信主的親友也告訴我,他的孩子,小小年 紀,得知爺爺患上癌症.便暗暗地在日記簿裏寫,為他的爺爺禱告;又有一位青年, 他小時在兒童主日學中最搗蛋,現在長大後竟成了一位傳道人,獻身為主。

這些事讓我認識到孩子上主日學的重要,他們雖會頑皮,未能集中,但只要把 他們聚在一起認識聖經,點點滴滴的真理知識仍能在他們心內萌芽,主日學的果效深 遠,能播下信仰的種子,改變小孩的生命和心思,並爲教會栽培出未來的領袖。

碰巧一天, Julia 姊妹來找我幫忙 JaM 一個月, JaM 就是三到六歲的兒童事工, 看到姊妹多年來,為了小孩子的屬靈餵養,家長們能安心崇拜,教會能增長,她甘心 犧牲自己的聚會時間,負責擔任領導此工作,為事工搜集材料,自己去接受訓練,和 教導小朋友,在嚴重的人手短缺下,她更常要四處求人來幫忙,並做培訓協調的工 作。我見她實在為難,便答應了,並在代課之先,先到 JaM 處看了一遍。 第一次參觀JaM,我才發現教會現在來了這麼多的小朋友,他們共同唱詩敬 拜,有些小朋友顕得很雀躍和投入,他們跟著老師又唱詩又拍手,也一些很害羞,不 時哭哭啼啼,不肯離開父母,由老師或父母抱着。小朋友共同崇拜後,便會按照年齡 分為兩組,由不同的老師帶領活動,我被派往負責五到六歲的一群。

經過當年的挫敗,今次我事先認真的祈禱和勤力備課,Julia 給我的教材很豐富 和多創意,跟上去不難,我事先把講授的大綱寫在「貓紙」上,並把內容背好,又蒐 集了一些相若的網上資料作視聽教具,小朋友聽著都很專注。為免同學分心和過份活 躍,我帶同了我的 iPad 來播放,又買了一大堆貼紙作問答獎品。想不到小小的獎勵, 小朋友都很歡喜和投入,感謝主!他們樂意地思考和答問,看到孩子們的歡笑、天真 、單純和投入,我感到很開心和鼓舞。

聽到Julia 要退下兒童主日學,我感到難過,但不覺意外。在嚴重缺乏人手下, 要達成這任務實在艱難,何況要持續不斷地求人來幫忙,就是對極有遠見和肯委身的 人來說,也會累下來,難怪她說要休息。

但另一方面, JaM 的前路又如何呢?為了小朋友可以認識主、家長能專心地敬 拜、教會能繼續增長,會友靈命更成長, JaM 的工作是必須的,是不可能廢去的。我 真盼望更多弟兄姊妹和家長能看到這事工的價值和重要,願意騰出時間和精神來為主 為人效力,這事工是關乎我們孩子和教會的未來命運,它需要一團隊工來共同承擔, 但願我們都能奉獻自己,叫主的工作能更大擴展,阿門!

We thank God for journeying with us through the challenges of lifegroup and His patience in seeing us find our feet again. We look forward to growing as a group as well as growing closer to God in our personal walk.

CHERISHED

Young Parents Life Group

Young Parents life group has grown from 4 couples to 11 couples. In the meeting, we talked about parenting issues and teach the biblical way of bringing up children.

Adult life groups

There are also a number of adult life groups meeting throughout the week on a fortnightly basis.

ReMix (High school ministry)

To build an atmosphere of trust, of friendship and of knowing that young members are valued, both by the leaders and ultimately by God.

University Life Group

This group of about 8-10 the previous few years has grown to about 35 committed university students. So at the beginning of this year, two more University age Life Groups were created.

STATE YOUTH GAMES
