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余超鷹傳道代表教牧同工團的報告:心意更新而變化

異象方向

神的心意乃鼓勵我們在世的日子,獻上自己(羅 12:1),服侍我們的神,其中當然包括福音使命。 作為教牧同工團的主席,我仍然相信,教會存在最重使命乃把福音傳開,然而,具體如何操作以 至落實則按各堂會及個人,我相信是不拘形式的。主要概念是,使用適當的平台和策略,旨在幫 助動員團隊以達到群體共同使命目標,而在面臨的最重大挑戰下,仍能取得進展,各按其時,成 為美好。

猶記得我在上一年分享到教牧與弟兄姊妹可以選擇發揮事奉中成為「聯盟」的福音與牧養的伙伴,雖然我們不能低估當中挑戰、阻力和懷疑。但我個人亦盡量在執事會的分享,教牧同工團的主旋律中,鼓勵這種理念,且按照不同文化,不同年齡層,進一步在不同堂會(粵/華/英)中落實。印象最深刻的是去年聖誕節,三個堂會合一地在火車站附近佈道,配合堂會各自崇拜佈道信息,以及一同歡慶的聖誕聚餐。

與此同時,回望過去一年,不同堂會,因著其特色文化,也有不同程度的進展。

粵語事工

今年度粵語堂亦有不少的進展,相信離不開神的眷顧,以及當中弟兄姊妹的熱心參與貢獻,無論 他們當中有沒有職份,不同弟兄姊妹提出各事奉層面的更新,雖然只是一點一滴的,我已樂觀其 成,並且使之穩步發展。

華語事工

今年在華語堂方面,記得陳傳道曾提到他的領受是一個都不能少也正是華語事工的使命。我亦喜 見今年華語事工有不同的嘗試,當中包括年青小組,以及在籌備中的英文班。

英語事工

而英語堂方面,黃傳道則提到 教會乃神建立的。 這個導向更進一步提醒我們一班信徒所有在教 會發生的一切也要看準神的心意,因為若不是耶和華神所建立的,建造的人就枉然勞力。我知道 英語堂有慕道班,門訓及牧養夫婦亦有一些新安排,為此我他們非常感恩。 在不同聚會聯繫中,其中自己最享受的是我和兩位傳道(陳傳道和黃傳道)的定期相聚,大家彼此 聯繫,互相代禱,當然集思整個教會的合作事奉目標。雖然大家見面彼此分享感恩的事情,亦有 分享彼此的忙碌與挑戰,但過程常常都充滿笑聲。

Transformation Through Renewal of Our Mind Report on Behalf of the Pastoral Team by Ps. Michael Yu

Vision and Direction

It is God's will for us to offer ourselves as a living sacrifice while we are on earth (Rom. 12:1), and to serve Him. One of the ways by which we can serve Him is evangelism. As the chair of the Pastoral Team, I still believe that the most important mission of the church is to evangelize. How this is done on a practical level is dependent on each congregation and the individual and does not have to take any particular form. The main point is, using the most appropriate platform and strategy, to assist in motivating the team members to achieve the common goal of the community in evangelism, so that even when facing the greatest challenges, we can still make progress, and in due course, achieve the desired outcomes.

I still remember in the past year I shared the message that the pastors and the congregations can choose to be partners in an alliance for evangelism and pastoral ministry in order to fully realize the potentials in our service, though we must not under-estimate the challenges, resistance and doubt which we may face. I personally also tried to share this message with the Deacons and the Pastoral Team, and to encourage this kind of understanding, so that this can be put into effect in the different congregations according to their different cultures and ages. I was deeply impressed by what we did last Christmas, when the three congregations went to evangelize together at the nearby train station, followed by the separate Christmas messages at the three worship services on Sunday, and then a combined Christmas lunch together. At the same time, when I look back to the past year, each congregation also developed at its own pace in accordance with its own culture.

Cantonese Ministry

The past year has seen quite a fair amount of development. I believe it is by God's grace, and through the earnest participation and contributions from the brothers and sisters, no matter whether they hold any particular office or not. Different individuals have suggested renewals at different levels of service. Though these were small steps, yet I was glad to see these coming to fruition and developing steadily.

Mandarin Ministry

I remember Ps. Chen once mentioned that the mission of the Mandarin ministry is to bring people to Christ by whatever means. I am glad to see that attempts have been made to start new ministries, including Youth Group and English Classes in preparation.

LifeSpring Ministry

Ps. Wong mentioned that God builds His own church. This reminds us once again that whatever we do in the church, we need to be aware of God's will. Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labour in vain. I give thanks to God for their Bible Seekers' class, Discipleship Training and the pastoral ministry for married couple.

In the many personal interactions, what I enjoy most is the regular fellowship that I have with Ps. Chen and Ps. Wong, to pray together and to gather our thoughts about cooperation to achieve the common goals of our pastoral ministries. Though we share our many thanksgivings, we also share our challenges and our busy schedules, and the process is often filled with laughter. Therefore, no matter whether in life or ministry, there are always moments of joy and anxiety. However, our faith can renew such circumstances. The goal of this renewal is because of God (Rom. 12:1-2), and the most important attitude in this process of renewal also requires faith and joy (1 Thess. 5:16-18).

This is because when we can face the vicissitude of life with joy, others who do not know God will see our life testimony and be attracted to Him, and we can shine forth with joy for Christ. May all our brothers and sisters experience joy in their service and are willing to shine for Christ. May God bless each one of you, bless CCCV, and enable us to be a blessing to others.

感谢我们的大牧者主耶稣基督的保守和眷顾,2017至2018年,信望爱堂的华语事工充满感恩!

首先,在下午堂方面,同工们热心参与各项事工,从祷告团契(周五姊妹祷告团契和礼拜天崇拜结束后的祷告小组)、查经(崇拜结束后的查经和两周一次的周六的华语堂联合查经)到探访弟兄姊妹,同工们都积极地参与;与华语崇拜同时进行的英语青少年团契也稳步进行,有时还有新人参与期间,也感恩在 Rev. Lam 请假的时候,就有英语堂的 Ps. Jono 的支援;更加感恩的是,还有杨姊妹在复活节的受洗归入耶稣基督。虽然由于神的清楚感动,参与下午华语堂崇拜和侍奉六年之久的周弟兄一家转去参与其他教会的侍奉,但是在我们为他们感到万分不舍而祷告和祝福之后,神又同时带领两个新的家庭的来到下午的华语堂参与崇拜和周六的查经团契。值得一提的是,去年受洗归入主耶稣基督的万叔叔贤伉俪热心传福音,邀请朋友加入我们教会,还热心参与慕道班的侍奉!

第二,上午堂方面,特别感恩粤语堂的同工们继续大力支持此项圣工,尤其在崇拜中的司琴,完全得力于粤语堂同工们的支援——愿神纪念他们在主耶稣基督里的劳苦,大大赐福他们!其他同工也是全力以赴的参与各种侍奉,虽然由于上午堂圣工刚开始启动,资源有所缺乏,但是同工们都是尽力而为!有的同工兼任几项侍奉,哪里有需要,就到那里的侍奉岗位,不管是崇拜中的司事,还是读经,还是主席,都是义不容辞。在大家的坚持不断的同心侍奉下,今年上午堂的华语堂有三位弟兄姊妹受洗归入基督耶稣。可惜,毕竟还是受制于资源的缺乏,人数增长缓慢,出席崇拜的人数不稳定。其中,就有些人因为找不到华语的在职青年团契而遗憾离开,也有些人由于发现教会没有英语学习班而失望离开。

因此,在同工们热心的参与和支持下,加上神特别的恩典和预备,现在,整个华语堂准备开始英语班来发展福音圣工,也开始了华语在职青年的团契的活动,希望通过这些平台的建立,能够留住以后再来的新人,更好传扬福音,带领教会增长。

与此同时,上午堂的华语事工也在周日中午的查经班和周四两周一次的生命基础班(之前是慕道班,如今有些改进)各项已经开始的圣工上继续稳步进行。并且为了更好整合资源,为了更好传扬福音,现在我与同工们在推动加强上下午堂弟兄姊妹的联系的相关活动。在2018年也正式安排每三个月的一次派福音单张和进行传福音的聚餐。其实,在这样条件有限的情况下,我们华语堂的弟兄姊妹还积极参与2017年中秋节期间中信在Ballarat的传福音的活动,收获颇丰!

期盼前面新的一年,我们的大牧者主耶稣基督继续大大使用信望爱堂热心侍奉的同工们,同心合意,一起兴旺华语堂的福音圣工。

Pastor Jonathan Wong's Report

粤語事工簡報及展望 2017/2018

兩年前,當我踏進信望愛堂事奉不久,已經有人告訴我,粵語事工年齡層的老化,言談間感到悲觀。但是,打從我在2015年12月來探訪教會及講道開始,我卻看到另一幅圖畫,就是粵語堂仍是充滿潛力的。在弟兄姊妹的背景及豐富人生經驗中,我看到新的可能性,亦按著本堂弟兄姊妹的背景氣質逐步發展。但相信神會逐步向我們揭示不同的機會,縱使有挑戰,去年的粵語事工,超越我們的所想所求,未能詳細盡錄,但主要分外展及內在關顧兩大方面。

外展方面

Ballarat 本土宣教 - 有超過半人直接或間接參與。而親自到當地參與的的也超過三分之一的人。 聖誕 Nunawading 火車站的傳福音 - 當中包括週六派單張,週日佈道會及聖誕聚餐。

老人院崇拜 - 這是因應本堂在院舍內一些因為身體原因,未能來粵語聚會友的靈性需要,本堂亦開托及組成了老人院崇拜服侍團隊,目前每月一次往一間老人院主領崇拜聚會,服侍人數平均 11 人,在我看來又是一個粵語堂崇拜的擴展,但已經是相等於粵語堂人數增加十分之一,分別只是他們不在 Nunawading 聚會,暫時每月見他們一次。

内在方面

關顧系統繼續強化,把一些探訪工作成為共同協作的服侍。作為粵語堂同工,我首先建立網上平台,記錄自己的探訪,也希望其他成員也逐步加入,若是大家也願意跟隨,那麼關顧工作能夠有系統,也是一個同心合作的事奉。

年輕夫婦組 - 感恩年輕夫婦組由最初由信主及慕道朋友組成的小組而轉型成為所有成員已信主的 小組。

其他方面

除了以上的事工外,男士小組、週五查經班、一些非正式的外展工作亦繼續在進行及開展之中。

最後,本年度粵語堂能取得以上的進展,當中感恩神的憐憫眷顧,亦不忘感謝當中熱心參與的弟 兄姊妹們。

展望

展望未來,我在禱告尋索中,我感覺粵語堂的使命可以包含福音與文化兩個層面。

福音方面,長期下來相信神會不斷向我們揭示,但按照目前我們群體的氣質,短中期的定位目標是操粵語(或是粵語較流利)的第一代移民。

除了福音是最重要的目標外,文化方面,作為海外華人教會,也可以作為承傳本身文化的平台。 而且,也並非完全未發生事情,因為本堂的某些週末,已經有書法班,也願意這些班也可繼續成 為讓人接觸教會的平台。

Cantonese Ministry --- Report and Prospect --- 2017/2018

Two years ago, soon after I began my pastoral ministry in CCCV, someone al-ready told me that the Cantonese congregation is gradually aging, painting a rather pessimistic picture. However, since I first visited the church and preached for the first time in December 2015, I have seen another picture, that is, the Cantonese congregation is still full of potential. In the midst of the varied back-grounds and rich life experiences of our brothers and sisters, I saw new possibilities, and began to gradually develop my pastoral ministry according to the backgrounds and characteristics of our brothers and sisters. I believe God will gradually reveal to us the many different opportunities, though we may face challenges. The development of our Cantonese ministry in the past year has exceeded what we had hoped and expected. I will not go into great details, but suffice to say that the developments covered two main areas --- external outreach and internal caring.

External: Outreach

- 1. Local mission to Ballarat --- more than half of the congregation participated directly or indirectly in this mission, and more than one third actually travelled to Ballarat.
- 2. Local evangelism at Nunawading station at Christmas --- distribution of flyers on Saturday, gospel meeting on Sunday and Christmas lunch.
- 3. Worship service at Elderly People's Homes --- this was to meet the spiritual needs of some members of the Cantonese congregation who live in these homes. Our church also formed a worship team to conduct a monthly worship service in one of these homes. The number of people attending this monthly service is around 11. To me this is an extension of our Cantonese

service, and is equivalent to an increase of around 10% in the Cantonese congregation. It is just that they do not worship at Nunawading, and we only see them once a month.

Internal: Ministry

- 1. Caring and Visitation --- we continued to strength our system for caring, and to encourage more people to participate in visitation. As the pastor in charge of the Cantonese ministry, I first established an online platform to record my own visitations, and to encourage others to join in. If others are willing to join in, then we would have a more systematic visitation ministry, one that is able to unite us together.
- 2. Young Couples' Group --- Our thanks to God for the establishment of this group. It started off as a group of young married couples who were seeking to know God and the Bible, and now has become a group of believers.

Others

1. Apart from the above, we also have the Brothers' group, Friday Night Bible Study Group, and other unofficial outreach activities.

Finally, the fact that we were able to achieve the above developments in the past year, was due first of all to God's continuing compassion and love, whilst not forgetting the active participation of our brothers and sisters.

Vision for the Future

I continue to search in my prayers. I feel that the mission of the Cantonese ministry can include both the gospel and culture. On the gospel level, I believe, in the long term, God will continue to reveal to us. However according to the characteristics of our congregation, for the short and medium terms, the target group for us will continue to be first generation Cantonese speaking Chinese migrants. Apart from evangelism as an important goal, on the cultural level, as an overseas Chinese church, we can also serve as a platform to inherit and impart our native culture such as conducting Chinese calligraphy class, and through this, continue to bring people into contact with our church.

信望愛堂已經走過了三十四年的歲月。記得我在三十週年的年報中分享了一些個人的立志, 就是『…至於我,和我家,我們必定事奉耶和華。』(書24:15下)在執事會的事奉已經有四年了,當中感受到同工們同心事奉的喜樂和甘甜。在此我代表弟兄姊妹們多謝執事們和教牧同工們的熱心事奉和付出。特別點名多謝彭俊傑弟兄和姜張佩佩姊妹六年來的事奉,他們的付出是大家有目共睹的。由於會章的規定他們必須退下來。另外想提名的是英文堂的潘芷芊姊妹,由於她將為人母,所以不會連任。對於她的決定雖然感到可惜,但是十分理解,深信主必定會大大地祝福她一家人。

感謝主的保守和帶領!過去的一年可以說是教會的整固期,各堂會的事工在三位牧者的努力下都 有穩步的進展。例如英文堂的人數有穩步的增加,除了有新來的弟兄姊妹,也有第三代的增長。 過去一年也舉行了兩次的水禮。讚美神!

粤語事工也有所加強。例如到安樂華人護理院的探訪已成為固定的事工。護理院的一些院友是我們教會的會友,他們不一定每一個星期都可以來到教會。我們便把教會帶到護理院,和他們一起敬拜主和施聖餐。年青夫婦小組有一對夫婦最近一起受洗見證主在他們身上的救恩。浸禮的當天我們還歡迎了九位轉會的弟兄姊妹。希望他們都能夠更加享受在主內的團契及一起參與事奉。

華語事工所面對的挑戰卻比較大。雖然有一批穩定的弟兄姊妹在默默地為主作工,也有新的朋友或者主內的弟兄姊妹來參加聚會,可是基於各種的原因,有一些弟兄姊妹卻不是經常來聚會,也有一些弟兄姊妹離開了我們的教會。加上陳傳道的離任,從人的角度來看華語事工的發展確是面對着極大的挑戰,但是我深信既然主容許這些事情發生,必有祂的美意。也祝福陳傳道和他的家人在將來事奉的道路當中更加經歷神的恩典和祝福!同時要感謝主的是駱牧師在教會有需要的時候,願意挺身而出作為華語事工的臨時牧者至今年年底。教牧同工團也會立刻起動新的聘牧程序,為華語事工尋找一位合適的牧者。懇請弟兄姊妹們同心為聘牧的事情禱告。

雖然是這樣,華語堂正在嘗試開展職青事工,希望能夠照顧到這群人屬靈的需要。我們也正在計劃開展英語班,希望藉着這個平台一方面讓國內來的新移民可以學習英文,同時也把福音傳給他們。

教會今年的重點是傳福音。其實我們去年中秋節的時候去過一趟 Ballarat,舉行了一個福音性的中秋晚會,幫助一位華人宣教士在當地的工作,對像主要是學生和中國的移民。從今年四月開始,教會每一個月的第四個星期六會有弟兄姊妹去 Ballarat 參與當地的福音工作。今年的下半年各個堂會都會舉行各自的佈道會,求主使用我們把袮的羊帶進天國裏。

今年特別感恩的是駱牧師和師母已經被澳洲的 Pioneers 接納為宣教士,而信望愛堂也成為一間 差派宣教士的教會。不過由於教會的需要,他們會把宣教的工作推遲。我相信神會透過我們與 Pioneers 的合作,使我們更加清楚地看見神奇妙的作為,叫我們更加有動力去完成祂所交託給我 們的大使命! 我只是在這裏點出了教會去年的一些主要的事工和稍為展望了來年的事工。大家如果要更深入地 了解教會各項事工的進展,請參閱年報裏各個事工或者部門的報告。總的來說,感恩的是教會整 體的事工都有穩步的進展,但是也面對着各種的挑戰。只要我們『是同心合意地興旺福音,我深 信那在你們心裏動了善工的,必成全這工,直到耶穌基督的日子。』(腓 1:5)

Annual Report 2018 – Deacons Board

CCCV has entered its 34th year. I still remember what I shared in the 30th Annual Report, where I mentioned it was my pledge that "...But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." (Joshua 24:15b) I have served on the Deacons Board for four years now. Throughout these years I felt the joy and pleasure when serving alongside with other deacons and the members of the Pastoral Team. On behalf of all brothers and sisters, I would like to thank all the deacons and the members of the Pastoral Team who have served the Church wholeheartedly. I would like to mention a few names: Simon Pang and Anissia Keung for they have served on the Board for six years and have to step down according the Rules of the Church. I am sure our Lord will remember their hard work. Joyce Poon, who is going to be a mother for the first time, so we will let her off the hook this time. May the Lord bless her family and her baby.

Thank God that He has kept us and guided us for the past year. With the hard work of our brothers and sisters and under the leadership of our pastors, it has been a year of consolidation as all ministries have been developing steadily. For example, the number of attendees has grown for LifeSpring. Many of them were brought here by our members. There is also natural growth where the third generation is springing out quickly.

Praise the Lord that we also held baptism ceremonies twice last year.

The ministries of the Cantonese congregation have also been strengthened. We now regularly visit the On Luck Chinese Nursing Home to provide worship services and administer Holy Communion for Christians living there. Some of them are our members who may not be able to come to the church regularly. The young couples group has been established for more than a year and we thank God that there was a couple who just got baptised in April. There were nine brothers and sisters transferred their membership to our church. I pray that they will enjoy even more the fellowship they have been having and we shall serve the Lord together.

On the other hand, the Mandarin congregations are facing some challenges although there is a core of brothers and sisters who have been serving the Mandarin ministry quietly and tirelessly. There were some new comers, but many of them did not stay for various reasons. It is going to be more challenging

as Pastor Chen is not continuing his service at CCCV, but I believe the Lord has His plan for us and for Pastor Chen. May the Lord continue to guide and bless Ps Chen and his family in his future endeavour. I thank the Lord that Rev Lok has kindly offered his help as the interim pastor for the Mandarin congregations until the end of this year. At the same time, we will start the pastoral search process to look for a suitable pastor, and I ask brothers and sister to keep praying about this.

Having said that, we have started a young people's group and hopefully, we can cater for the spiritual needs of some Mandarin speaking young working adults. We are also planning to start English classes for new migrants from mainland China who want to learn English. Our ultimate goal about the English classes is to spread the Gospel.

Out-reaching is the main emphasis for this year. We have started some out-reaching work during last year's Mid-Autumn festival as we travelled to Ballarat to help out a missionary. She has been doing a lot of work in establishing a fellowship for the students in Ballarat and some migrants from mainland China. Starting from April this year, we will go to Ballarat once a month to help building the fellowship. During the second half of the year we will have Gospel rallies organised by individual congregations. May God use what we have planned and bring your own sheep to your Kingdom.

This year is definitely a special year for CCCV as Rev Lok and Catherine have been accepted as the full-time missionaries of Pioneers Australia (although they will be delaying the work associated with Pioneers due to the reasons mentioned above). I thank God for this as this is the first time that we are sending missionaries. I am sure through the partnership with Pioneers, Rev Lok and Catherine, God will help us see His wonderful work throughout the world, so that we may be encouraged in carrying out His great commission.

I only mentioned some highlights for the past year, and have a little peek into the coming year. I am sure our pastors and leaders of various ministries/groups will have more details about their specific areas of ministry throughout this report. As a whole, I thank our Lord that CCCV is growing steadily although there are challenges ahead of us. However, I trust our Lord "...who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." (Philippians 1:5)

A New Mission!

In April, CCCV celebrates its 34th anniversary. April would also mark the end of our 18th and last year for Patrick as a pastor of CCCV. However it is not goodbye! We are thankful that God has provided CCCV as our church family who will be sending us out into the mission field. We look forward to be cared for by you!

It will be another step of faith for us, believing that God is calling us to go back into the mission field. It is not without some struggles and even doubts. However we have to trust in our Heavenly Father for confirmation of His direction and provision for all needs.

What does Pioneers missionaries do?

We work to reach out to Unreached People Groups (UPG) around the world. These are ethnic groups that have little contact with Christians or the Gospel. Pioneers exist because God wants every tongue, tribe and nation to hear about what Jesus has done for them. It is hard work, in difficult and often isolated places.

What kind of training are we involve in?

The training is to equip a missionary to cross over into another culture and be able to understand the culture and language so that they can share the Gospel in a way that is relevant to the people. The training will also teach the missionaries how to care for themselves in difficult and lonely circumstances as well as remain spiritually strong.

Who are we training?

Includes missionaries from China, Korea, Pakistan, Mongolia, besides the traditional sending countries.

Where are we going?

Have you heard of Montenegro? Or Georgia? You may have heard that we are always going to Chiang Mai. We are looking for places safe to train missionaries from countries that persecute Christians. The country we relocate should also have a low cost of living, easy to obtain visas and has an international airport.

When are we starting and relocating?

Actually the work has already started and Patrick has been travelling frequently. The relocation will come when the training has been fully developed and a suitable location identified. Meanwhile we will work from Australia.

In Australia, Patrick is in the process of organising the Pioneers' Global Chinese team. Pioneers Chinese aims to work with the diaspora Chinese churches globally to mobilise them for UPG missions. Pioneers Chinese aims to raise cross-cultural workers to work amongst UPGs as well as missionaries who will train, care and support Mainland Chinese missionaries working with UPGs.

We thank God for our CCCV church family, whom we have the privilege to work alongside in building CCCV for almost two decades. Now we look forward to members' support and partnership as we prepare to build God's kingdom in the wider world.

May God strengthen us and pour His grace in all that we do.

我們的培訓涉及哪些內容?

宣教培訓是裝備宣教士如何進行跨文化宣教並且能理解相關的文化和語言,以致能夠與其他文化的人群相關地分享福音。培訓也包括教導宣教士在艱難困苦和孤單的環境下如何照顧自己以及如何保持靈性剛強。

培訓對像是誰?

培訓物件除了傳統差遣國的宣教士之外,也包括中國,韓國,巴基斯坦,蒙古等國的宣教士。

我們到哪裡去?

你們聽說過黑山共和國嗎?或者格魯吉亞?你們可能聽說過我們總是去清邁。我們要尋找一些安全地方來培訓來自迫害基督徒國家的宣教士。我們遷移的國家還需具備生活成本低,方便獲取簽證並具有國際機場等條件。

我們何時啟動和遷移?

實際上此項事工已經啟動而且駱牧師本人已多次去國外參與這事工。當培訓完全展開並且確定合適的地點後,就將進行遷移。在此期間我們仍將繼續在澳洲工作。

駱牧師正在澳洲進行「先鋒」機構的全球中國團隊的組織事工。「先鋒」中國團隊旨在與分散在 全球的華人教會一起工作以推進他們向未得之民宣教。「先鋒」中國團隊旨在訓練跨文化工作者 在未得之民中開展事工,以及宣教士。這些宣教士將會培訓、關懷和支援與未得之民一起工作的 中國大陸宣教士。

我們為信望愛堂這個教會大家庭感謝神,使我們有幸在建立教會過程中與同工們一起並肩事奉了近二十年。今天我們預備在更廣闊的世界中建立神的國度,並期待教會成員的支持和合作。

願神堅固我們,並將祂的恩典傾倒在我們所做的一切。

緬甸短宣之旅分享

這次探訪緬甸,實在獲益良多。

令我留下非常深刻印象的是:

- (1) My house 的小朋友們是音樂發燒友,有超級强勁的音樂細胞,無論在唱歌,樂器彈奏上都很投入,看到他們載歌載舞時的喜樂與投入,似是與音樂融為一體了,盡顯他們生命的活力及喜樂,神藉着願意委身的宣教士當地努力,又藉不同教會的弟兄姊妹看見同一異像,同心服事當地有需要的小朋友(太10:42)。
- (2) 本人被教會安排在緬甸一些教會示範以插花來講福音,但到了當地才發覺鮮花是少得驚人, 花的品種亦非常有限,我內心不其然的向神求救,[神阿,花都無,點插呀?但神給我的答案是: 要注意,不要管點插花,重點在用插花作引子,講福音],其中見到教會有很多姊妹都有興趣學插花,插花可為她們帶來就業及傳福音的機會。

這次短宣之旅令我有着從未有過的喜樂,每次回想起小朋友們的笑臉,天真,活潑,可愛,都會想有機會一定要再去與他們見面。

我們由 2012 年 3 月 21 日開始,在神的幫助和保守下,用了三年半的時間,通過了聖經信息協會的嚴格讀經要求,完成了查考創世記、出埃及記、馬可福音、羅馬書、詩篇、約翰福音、利未記、路加福音、使徒行傳、加拉太書、以弗所書、腓立比書等第一期查經證書的十二個書卷。感謝主,其中五位學員在 2016 年 11 月 13 日獲頒**聖經信息查經班第一期結業證書**,一方面用以鼓勵學員繼續用心研讀神的話語;另一方面亦標誌著學員曾有系統地研讀聖經,對神的的救贖計劃和啟示有了更深的認識。其實這個查經課程,是神賜下的美好的屬靈筵席,甚願更多的弟兄姊妹能一起享用,在神話語的追求上,經歷主的豐富。

第二期查經證書課程於 2015 年 10 月 14 日開始,須分十次課程查考 24 個書卷。在本文跟大家見面時,學員已經完成查考課程一至課程七的民數記、申命記、馬太福音、約書亞記/士師記/路得記、撒母耳記上下、哥林多前書/腓利門書/俄巴底亞書、及列王紀上下。

按現時的進度安排,今年六月學員將會查考課程八的帖撒羅尼迦前後書/提摩太前書/提多書/瑪拉基書,至今年年底就能完成課程九的但以理書/撒迦利亞書,到明年第一季查考完畢課程十的約珥書/啟示錄,就可以完成第二期的查經證書課程。十年完成查考 66 卷聖經的心願,至此完成了三份之二。

現時穩定參加查經的組員粵語組八人、華語組五人。但有時組員因自己或家人的需要而影響了出席,所以請繼續為弟兄姊妹能穩定出席及恆心研讀神的話語代禱。

"若有人在基督裹,他就是新造的人,舊事已過,都變成新的了。"(林後5:17)這節经文,常用來勉勵初信的人,但我讀來,卻是另一番感受。

很多癌症病患者,他們在患病和療程後,在外觀,人生觀,管理時間的優先次序,與親人的關係,甚至在獨處時,都有不少改變。我患病已有兩年多,经歷兩次復發,做過手術,化療,放射治療,至現在的標靶治療,已明白若癌細胞不能被徹底消滅,就只能與它共存,成為長期病患者。在健康情況許可下,我如常起居生活,駕車,購物,返教會,上興趣班,至於食葯,見醫生,驗血,做掃描檢查,亦成為生活的一部份。有新認識的朋友,驚訝第一次見面,我就告知她我有癌症,因為她有親友患病,深居簡出,除至親好友外,不願接觸其他人,所以她說:"你真堅強!"噢!堅強?我從來未想過這就是堅強,原來堅強,在不同的人有不同的理解。

當別人第一次形容我堅強時,我以為別人想鼓勵我而已,到第二,三次再有人提及我堅強時,我才明白神已給我足夠的能力渡過,患病的兩年多,神的恩典夠我用,"你的日子如何,力量也如何。"(申 33:25)

在超市碰到一個久別重逢的朋友,我告訴她癌症復發一事,她的回應是:你看來很喜樂,內心有主的平安很重要,會為你禱告。道別後,我不斷在想:"喜樂?我對她說過什麼?我有對她笑嗎?"自問不是樂天派的人,患病總會有憂心掛慮的時候,但神是奇妙的,在我以為不足時,他已賜下平安喜樂,且讓旁人去提醒我:"不是靠自己,乃靠主。"

堅強,勇敢,喜樂都不是我用來形容自己的詞語,但神藉著人生的際遇經歷,讓我在當中有很多的操練。感謝神的恩典,感謝親友和教會弟兄姊妹們的禱告,關心和支持,在療程中與我同行。有一本書的作者說: "癌症病人不要想看自己有多少日子,只要一直往前走就可以了。"讓主牽我一直往前走...
